□Prospective college students from low-SES backgrounds are less likely to have access to informational resources about college (Brown, Wohn, & Ellison, 2016). Students from lower socioeconomic backgrounds are more likely to drop out of high school without earning a high school diploma (7 percent) or complete only a high school degree (21 percent) compared with students from high socioeconomic status backgrounds (1 percent and 3 percent, respectively) (National Center for Education Statistics 2015).

Low or no expectancy ("helplessness") is also related to low socioeconomic status (Odéen et al., 2012). In short, being poor is associated with lowered expectations about future outcomes. The student's attitude about learning (his or her mind-set) is also a moderately robust predictive factor (Blackwell, Trzesniewski, & Dweck, 2007).

Students from low-SES families typically: Achieve at lower levels than do students from middle- and high-SES families; Enter kindergarten with significantly lower language skills; Score at least 10% lower than the national average in mathematics and reading; Students living in poverty are much more likely to be absent from school, which also affects their learning.

Because of poverty, "Students from low-income families are 2.4 times more likely to drop out than middle-income kids, and over 10 times more likely than high-income peers to drop out" For children with low resources, the risk factors are similar to others such as juvenile delinquency rates, higher levels of teenage pregnancy, and the economic dependency upon their low-income parent or parents.
