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The format of The Art of War is a Socratic dialogue. The purpose, declared by Lord Fabrizio Colonna (perhaps Machiavelli's persona) at the outset, "To honor and reward virtue, not to have contempt for poverty, to esteem the modes and orders of military discipline, to constrain citizens to love one another, to live without factions, to esteem less the private than the public good."

The Medici family came into power in 1512, toppling the republic. Machiavelli was imprisoned and tortured by Giuliano de Medici, ruler of Florence 1512-1513, as a suspect conspirator. The Prince (1513) was dedicated to the father of Giuliano, Lorenzo Medici, with the hopes that the Medicis would defend Italy from France and Spain. (In 1527 the Medicis were out and the republic restored, but not Machiavelli.)
